
Dinocheirus panzeri



The cephalothorax and pedipalps are red-brown and the opisthosomal tergites honey-brown. Distribution: Central and N. Europe, to England, Denmark, S. Sweden, Holland, north as far as Finland and Lapland. In Britain it is found throughout England, being recorded also from southern Scotland and Northern Ireland. It is likely that this species has a more widespread distribution than the records suggest. *Dinocheirus panzeri* is a mainly synanthropic species occurring in hay, straw and grain refuse in barns and warehouses. It also occurs inside old established chicken houses and pigeon lofts. Away from man it has been found in birds', mammals' and ant nests and rarely under tree bark and in rotting tree stumps. It appears to be phoretic on, at least, birds. Length of body: 2. I-2. 6mm.
